THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 30, 2010

Morning Tour: 09.30–12.00: Private guided tour - the tour gives an overview of the history of the College, its architecture, famous graduates, and an introduction to the Old Library and the Book of Kells exhibition.

Afternoon Tour: 1.30pm – 18.00 approx

North Coast and Malahide Castle Tour. Malahide, which means "on the brow of the sea", is a village nine miles north of Dublin. The castle is close to the village and is built on a small rise, which commands a view of the bay. There are many magnificent oaks, chestnuts and sycamores dating to the days of the Tudors. Malahide is a 12th century castle; one of Ireland's oldest and most historic with excellent collection of period furniture, oil portraits. The castle belonged to the Talbot family from 1185 to 1976 when it was sold to Dublin County Council. The castle itself is a combination of styles and periods; the medieval Great Hall is the only one in Ireland that is preserved in its original form while the National Portrait Gallery features many fine portraits of the Talbot family and 18th and 19th Irish Notables.

FRIDAY, OCTOBER 1, 2010

Morning: Guided Tour of National Art Gallery OR Tour of "Number Twenty Nine" Fitzwilliam Square

National Art Gallery: This is Ireland's main art gallery, consisting of a huge collection. There is also a large new section which is primarily there to facilitate visiting exhibitions.

"Number Twenty Nine" Fitzwilliam Square

Number Twenty Nine is Dublin's Georgian House Museum. Visitors take a guided tour from the basement to the attic, through rooms which have been furnished with original artifacts as they would have been in the years 1790 to 1820.

Number Twenty Nine Lower Fitzwilliam Street, was first occupied in 1794, during a time of great change and expansion in Ireland's capital. The first occupant was Mrs. Olivia Beatty, the widow of a prominent Dublin wine merchant. Visiting the exhibition gives young and old alike a chance to experience what life was like for the fortunate who lived in such elegant townhouses, and the less fortunate who worked in them.

The exhibition is a partnership between Electricity Supply Board and the National Museum of Ireland, and has been playing an important role since 1991 in making more accessible the history of late Georgian Dublin

Afternoon Tour: Powerscourt House & Gardens and Glendalough Tour

Powerscourt House and Gardens is located in a stunning natural setting at Enniskerry, Co. Wicklow, approximately 45 minutes from Dublin city centre. A magnificent period home dating from mid 18th century, overlooking wonderful terraced gardens and an ornamental lake, Powerscourt House was partially destroyed by fire in 1974. A long restoration project ensued during which the ballroom and the garden rooms were rebuilt. Powerscourt is a magnificent example of an aristocratic garden with Italian and Japanese themes, herbaceous borders, ornamental lakes, splendid statuary, decorative ironwork, a pets' cemetery and an extensive tree collection. Laid out in the 1840's with flair, knowledge and imagination, it is probably the last garden of its size and quality ever to have been created.

On site at Powerscourt is also Ireland's premier shopping emporium "Avoca Hand Weavers".

Glendalough "The Glen of two Lakes" – a Spellbinding place, an Ancient Monastic settlement situated beneath Sheer cliffs carved by Glaciers during the Ice Age. Once the Monastic capital of Europe, founded by St Kevin (6th century)

Evening: Drinks and Dinner at the "Irish Party House"

The Irish House Party is completely unique in Dublin. Unlike any other traditional Irish music night in the city, it is organized and hosted by All-Ireland champion traditional Irish musicians and dancers in an intimate and homely setting. A thoroughly enjoyable evening.

There are no stages, microphones or fake antiques hanging from the walls commonplace at the many 'Irish music nights' around Dublin. This has made the evening hugely popular with both Irish guests and guests from abroad.
